Phlebitis – in Peripheral IVs Phlebitis has long been recognized as a risk for infection. For adults, lower extremity insertion sites are associated with a higher risk for infection than are upper extremity sites. Intravenous Nursing Society (INS) phlebitis scale; Grade 0 no symptoms Grade 1 erythema at insertion site with or without pain

Management Stop the infusion Disconnect the iv tubing, attach a syringe and aspirate any residual drug from the site Determine if infusate is a vesicant or irritant Remove the iv if it is not a vesicant Leave the iv in situ if it is a vesicant Describe the site using the INS classification scale Elevate the affected extremity ...
